The Trail of the Ancients Scenic By-way is a beautiful 500-mile trek designed to explore Northwestern New Mexico's rich cultural, geological, and anthropological histories. The By-way passes through the unique geology of the Colorado Plateau's high desert, offering stunning rock formations, culture rich historic sites, National monuments and more.

The Trail of the Ancients Scenic By-way provides insights into the Ancestral Puebloans, Navajo/Dine', Ute, Zuni

Pueblo, and Apache peoples. The Trail of the Ancients was designated as a Scenic By-way by the Federal Government in 2021.

Sites along the By-way include: Chaco Culture National Historic Park, El Malpais National Monument, El Morro National Monument, Zuni Pueblo, Aztec Ruins National Monument, Bisti Wilderness Area, De-Na-Zin Wilderness Area, Wild Spirit Wolf Sanctuary, and all the unique assets in the cities along the way.

HISTORY OF THE GALLUP INTER-TRIBAL CEREMONIAL



It's that time of year again, when Gallup is awash in the colorful sights and sounds of its annual Inter-Tribal Indian Ceremonial. Founded in 1921, the Gallup Inter-Tribal Ceremonial is the oldest of its kind in the United States, a ten day event whose sole purpose is to "preserve and perpetuate Native American art and culture." Tribes from across the United States and beyond are featured in a veritable showcase of Native art, dance, history, song, horsemanship, food and culture. From pageants to art shows, rodeos to Pow Wows, the Gallup Inter-Tribal Ceremonial offers a unique and authentic experience for participants and attendees alike. While watching the Saturday parade on the streets of downtown Gallup or visiting the juried Art Show at Red Rock State Park, you witness firsthand the pride, strength and creativity of America's first peoples.

The Gallup Inter-Tribal Ceremonial offers numerous venues to attract a visitor for a day or a week. The Night Performance presents dancing from nearly twenty tribes: Cheyenne, Comanche, Navajo, Hopi, Sioux and Aztec to name a few. The Pow Wow holds song and dance competitions from Tiny Tots and Grandmother Categories to fancy shawl and feather dances. Every year there is a highly regarded Gallup Inter-Tribal Queen pageant. This prestigious event awards young Native American women for their skills in public speaking, essay writing and cultural knowledge and expression. Then there is always the Rodeo, a highly anticipated crowd pleaser. The Rodeo has eight standard rodeo events open to world-class competitors as well as old school style events.

In the main Exhibition Hall, away from inspiring dance and competition, you will find exquisite Native American art: beautifully woven Navajo rugs, ceremonial baskets, hand coiled pottery, colorful kachinas, carved fetishes and handcrafted Hopi, Navajo and Zuni jewelry. Each piece is unique, reflecting both enduring cultural traditions and contemporary artistic vision.

Finally, it's good to consider the past when speaking of the Gallup Inter-Tribal Ceremonial today. It's good to know, that like today, people came together then to

"share in the beauty of their culture and history."

"We shared our stories and songs," a Navajo elder said. "Apache, Ute, Navajo. We camped on the north side of town in covered wagons. We shared our teachings, our healings, our prayers and herbs. All the sacred feathers came together and the Spirit was dancing."

EL MORRO THEATRE

The historic El Morro Theatre in Gallup, New Mexico, is a movie theatre and performing arts center. Designed by noted theater architect Carl Boller, the facility opened in 1928 as a “castle of pleasure and art”. It shares a common heritage with the KiMo Theater in Albuquerque and the Lencic Theater in Santa Fe, both also being Boller-designed theaters.

Today, the 460-seat theater is used for film exhibition and performing arts. In 2015, the city dedicated the El Morro Events Center, a multi-purpose meeting facility that is connected to the historic theatre. In addition, the theatre features comfortable

seating, a new Dolby Digital 7.1 Sound System, a high-end Christie Digital Projector, and new curtains and aisle lights to make your movie going experience top notch. Tours of the facility are free during business hours (evenings after 6pm and weekends between 2pm-10pm) or by appointment (call 505-726-2600). AMERICAN HISTORY

Often referred to as the Main Street of America, Route 66 has been transporting us since 1926. It would be only a handful of years after 1926 that the highway that stretched from Chicago to Santa Monica would transport almost a quarter million people from Dust Bowl torn states to California. The decade after the Dust Bowl, American songwriter Bobby Troup composed Route 66. This song has been redone a number of times by many artists, all who seem to "Get your kicks on Route 66." Gallup has always prided itself for being a part of this American history.



It wasn't that long ago that you drove through Gallup on Route 66 instead of bypassing it on Interstate 40. For the many who still exit off of the soulless interstates to find the Spirit of America, a treasure awaits in Gallup, New Mexico. The Mother Road will take you past beautiful neon business and hotel signs that are truly Americana. A number of diners, not chain restaurants, still serve up tasty breakfast, lunch and dinners from one end of our town to the other. Plus, the iconic El Rancho Hotel that housed a number of movie stars during the golden era of Hollywood sits right on Route 66.

Hollywood revisited Route 66 again this century with the creation of the Disney movie Cars. It is a story of how this new interstate system took travelers off of the Main Street of America and left many towns as the backdrop to this new and mighty road system. One look at the movie and you realize the area around Gallup was the inspiration behind Cars. You could replace our town with that of Radiator Springs.

On this visit make sure you cruise Route 66 slowly. Take in the history of the Highway. Enjoy the sites, food and stop in a couple of the family owned businesses.

The reigning queen enjoys a year of prominence, representing Native American and Indigenous cultures at various events, including state fairs, tribal gatherings, and more.

UNM-Gallup's Outdoor Fitness Trail, in particular, offers a serene place for hiking, exercising and taking in the gorgeous landscape.

The trail is made up of two loops behind the Physical Education Complex. With several gentle hills, the larger trail is approximately 1 mile in length, and the smaller trail is about ¼ mile in length.

Several fitness stations are located along the trail to enhance and complete your full workout.

Art Appreciation 101

UNM-Gallup is a hidden gem of the local art scene.

The campus is sprinkled with public art pieces, including sculptures, tapestries, paintings, prints and installations by renowned artists such as Emmi Whitehorse, Hung Liu, Tom Waldron, Nocona Burgess, Patrick Marold and others.

The Ingham Chapman Gallery inside Gurley Hall regularly showcases the work of local and regional artists throughout the year. In 2023, the gallery featured shows and artist talks by Duhon James, Eric-Paul Riege, Virginia Primozic and Aaron Berg.

The gallery also hosts student shows every semester so you can see the promising work of tomorrow's artists.

The gallery has a permanent collection of art featuring artists such as Beatie Yazz, Irving Toddy, Mick Burson, Miles Douglas and more, which can be seen publicly at certain times of the year.

Ingham Chapman Gallery hours are noon-4 p.m. Monday through Thursday and 9 a.m.-1 p.m. Friday.

Expand your horizons

UNM-Gallup's Zollinger Library is fully open to the community for research and engagement needs with few restrictions. Anyone is welcome to enjoy the library's great collection of books and films or to check out a board game, puzzle or coloring sheet.

The library also offers study rooms, workstations for laptops and other mobile devices, a computer lab, and personal computer pods throughout the building.

The library has monthly programs and special events, so you might catch a lecture or presentation by UNM-Gallup's expert faculty or a special guest, a documentary film about a culturally relevant subject, or even some Pokémon during a gathering for trainers.

UNM-Gallup's student clubs are also known to organize fun events and social gatherings on campus throughout the year, including cultural celebrations, video game and chess tournaments, and other crafts and activities.

The Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Office further helps create a sense of belonging on campus for all by hosting events in celebration of Native American Heritage Month, Black History Month, Women's History Month, Pride Month, and more.

BUYING AUTHENTIC NATIVE AMERICAN ART

COLLECTORS AND ART LOVERS FROM AROUND THE WORLD COME TO GALLUP TO PURCHASE AUTHENTIC NATIVE AMERICAN ART

The popularity of Native American jewelry has grown tremendously, but that has resulted in a blossoming imitation art industry. Advocates for the authenticity of Native American arts are fighting hard against those who are damaging the livelihood of the genuine Native Artists. Fortunately, there are ways that you can learn how to shop “real”.

Here are three recommendations on how to discern the quality of the jewelry you're shopping for.

Ask the questions:

- Is it nickel or sterling silver?
- Is the turquoise treated, stabilized, or natural?
- Is the piece stamped by an artist?

These questions add up to factor into the next suggestion.

Determine if the deal is “too good to be true”.

- Natural turquoise is a high grade gem quality stone and many of the mines have closed over the years so the supply is limited. This comes with a higher price tag.
- Some pieces may be nickel silver with sterling silver plating. You can tell by the weight of the piece (especially larger ones like bolos and cuff bracelets) - the heavier the piece the more likely it is that the material is sterling.
- Sterling silver comes at a higher cost and you also need to factor in the labor of the artist.

Make more than one stop. Ask around. Get the local insight.

- Ask the residents of the community where they shop.
- Ask people about their favorite artists and why- some artists deal exclusively with particular traders and you want to make sure you're headed in the right direction.
- Look at reviews on travel sites (Tripadvisor, Yelp, etc) and check out the artist and trader's websites. Many have websites and Facebook pages that can give you more in-depth information about the artists themselves and how the pieces are made. There is a directory of traders in this visitor's guide as well as on www.visitgallup.com, where you can find links to their websites.

Regardless of quality and price we encourage you to invest in what you love- if you love how it looks, take it home. We want you to be able to talk about your experience buying your piece positively and with pride, and there is something for every collector and shopper in Gallup.





FIBER ARTS

NAVAJO STYLE

In 1886, a trader by the name of John Bradford (J.B.) Moore purchased a Trading Post in Crystal, New Mexico. Located at the base of the Chuska Mountains on the west side, it made for a beautiful location but with harsh winters. The previous owner would close the Trading Post during the winter months. However, J.B. would remain open and employed Navajo weavers to make rugs in a style that was loosely based on popular Oriental weavings of the time. Of course, Navajo rugs had already been woven for centuries, but they had yet to be marketed like J.B. Moore was about to do.

The J.B. Moore catalog first appeared in 1903 and was sent to potential mail order customers located in populated parts of the United States. This important catalog would introduce many for the first time to the Navajo





and their crafts. Moore would educate people on the process of Navajo rug weaving, the materials used, and the spiritual qualities of the weavings. Another catalog was published in 1911, and both catalogs would be very successful.

Other Indian Traders would play very important roles in the development of the Navajo rug industry. John Lorenzo Hubbell of the famed Hubbell Trading Post in Ganado, Arizona promoted Navajo weaving and had a part in the creations of Ganado Red and Klagetoh. Local Gallup, Indian Trader C.N. Cotton also played a pivotal role in promoting Navajo rugs. Like J.B. Moore, he would create mail order catalogs which would sell Navajo rugs across the country.

Gallup now serves as the source to find these fascinating weavings. Only a handful of Trading Posts remain on the Navajo Nation. You will find our local Trading Posts filled with Ganado Reds, vegetal-dyed Wide Ruins, storm patterns, raised outlines, Yei' be' Chei', Klagetoh, and many other styles from the Navajo rug weavers. On your visit to the Trading Post, you might even be lucky enough to see one of these talented weavers come into the business to sell their rug: A transaction which can take a good amount of time to complete, where the trader and weaver go back and forth until the right price is met.

MAKING CLAY INTO ART

For centuries pottery has been associated with the Native American culture. These skills were essential for survival. Early Native American communities would use pottery to hold water, keep grain, store food, and keep seeds for the next growing seasons. Every time old ruins are found, you know that many different shapes and sizes of pottery will be unearthed. If you have seen one of these early pieces of pottery, you recognize that they are only similar to today's pottery in shape and size.

Eventually, pottery would stop having a utilitarian use and become a work of art. The first tribes who would become known for their decorative pottery would be the Pueblo Tribes along the Rio Grande Valley and the Hopi who inhabit the high mesas of Arizona.



Names like Nampeyo and Maria would turn a not-so-appreciated art into something highly regarded and an extremely valuable collectible. The Navajo would even begin to create their pitch pottery for the market.

The first collectors would take their buying trips to the Rio Grande Valley and the isolated Hopi Mesas. However, Gallup continued to play a very important role in developing the Native American arts and crafts industry. This made perfect sense because of its proximity to the Navajo, Zuni and Hopi Reservations. Artists simply had to make the trip into Gallup to sell their handmade crafts. As the arts and crafts industry grew, it drew those artists from the Rio Grande Pueblos and Acoma to make the journey here to sell.

Today, when you walk into one of Gallup's many Native American arts businesses, you will be greeted by some amazing displays of handmade pottery. You will find shelves filled with lizards, owls, and deer decorating Zuni bowls, canteens, and jars. The many styles of Hopi pottery, whether it is a decorated plate, a large wedding vase, or a unique carved Kachina. Acoma pottery will be immediately recognized because of those fine black geometric designs against a white background. Navajo artists will etch intricate designs into ceramic pottery and finish them with a delicate painted scene. Plus, you will find those coveted pieces of Santa Clara, Zia and Santa Ana Pueblo pieces that have made the journey from the Rio Grande Valley.



PAWN GALLUP STYLE

The pawn industry is a little different in Gallup. Here you will find Trading Posts offer pawn services as a personal cultural safe for traditional Native American treasures. When many people think of a pawn shop you might imagine a shop filled with electronics, musical instruments and gold jewelry for sale. However, in Gallup you will find most of the Trading Posts that offer pawn services offer huge inventories of pawn for sale, often referred to as "Dead Pawn" or "Old Indian Pawn." The Trading Posts are filled with natural turquoise bracelets, natural red coral beads, 100-year-old Concho belts, squash blossom necklaces, ceremonial buckskins, baskets, saddles, Navajo woven rugs, and Pendleton blankets. These are the valuables that the Navajo, Hopi, and Zuni pawn customers use to secure loans instead of working with a traditional bank. It is a much



easier transaction that does not involve the scrutiny of a credit check and the lengthy application forms of a bank loan. It is a financial system that has worked since New Mexico was still a territory. The vastness of the Navajo Nation, and the remoteness of the Zuni Reservation, played an important role in the establishment of Trading Posts and a working financial system for Native Americans. Many customers use the pawn shop to keep their family heirlooms safe. Pawn Shop vaults serve as the customer's personal safe and are filled with priceless family heirlooms. These possessions will be taken out when needed for special occasions like ceremonies, graduations, weddings, and when they are passed onto the next generation.

No trip to Gallup is complete without a visit to one of our great Trading Post shops. Once you enter a local pawn shop, you will be immersed in an old way of doing business.

TRADING POST HISTORY

The first Trading Posts were founded after 1868, when Navajos who had been rounded up by Kit Carson were returned to their vast homeland now limited by reservation borders. It did not take long for traders from the outside to move in to provide basic supplies. Flour, sugar, and cloth were exchanged for wool, pine nuts, and rugs. Traders served as interpreters, letter writers, and art agents, becoming a key link between two cultures. Commerce was the common language as traders extended credit for pawned jewelry, saddles, and guns. Though other native people, such as Zuni, Acoma and Hopi, used trading posts, it was the numerous and scattered Navajo who relied on them the most.

When the United States government moved west and started to claim territory, a system was needed to take care of these new Native American citizens. The government gave contracts to adventurous businessmen who would set up Trading Posts on the remote parts of the Navajo Reservation. These new businesses would supply area residents with the essentials like coffee and flour. It would eventually evolve into a very important part of the community. As the years passed and Gallup transitioned into a major trade center for the Navajo Nation, many of these Indian Traders would move off of the Reservation and into Gallup. The roles of the Trading Post would also change. No longer would their shelves be supplying local residents with the everyday essentials, but instead showcases would be added to display all of the beautiful Native American arts and crafts which were being made by our local artisans.

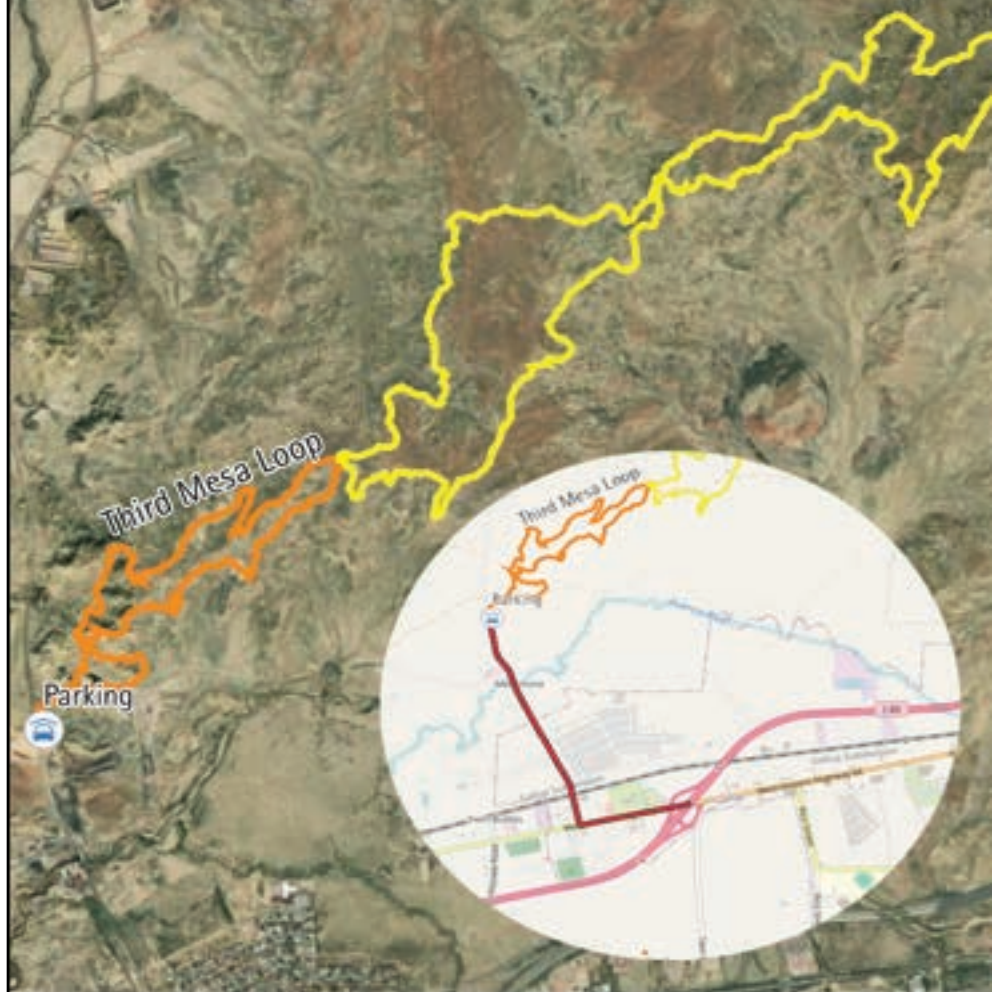
Gallup is the destination for Native American arts and crafts buyers. Buyers might be individual collectors or wholesalers who come here to purchase authentic Native American arts for their own businesses. The success of marketing Native American arts and crafts to those outside our region has created a thriving cottage industry for our local Native American artisans. It is not uncommon to find entire families who work fulltime in hand-making arts and crafts for local businesses. This system of local craftsmen and Trading Posts works. The Trading Post is able to accumulate a diverse collection from various artists to please the tastes of the many different buyers who make the journey here.

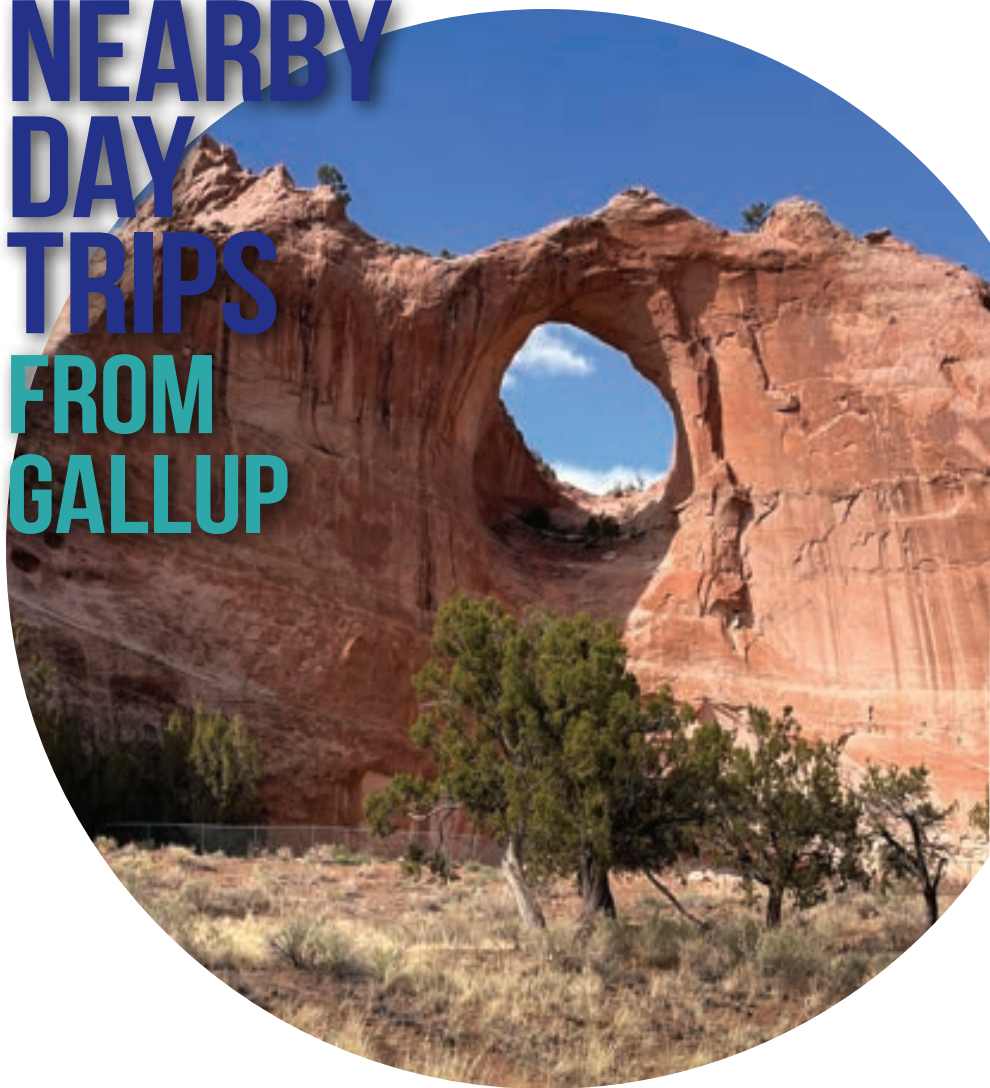

WINDOW ROCK AND THE NAVAJO RESERVATION

The Navajo Nation extends over 27,000 square miles across Utah, Arizona and New Mexico. The Navajo Reservation is home to unparalleled beauty, more than a dozen national monuments, tribal parks and historical sites and is peppered with numerous lakes and ponds. Lake Powell alone has 186 miles of Navajo land shoreline.

Here, you can step back in time and see how the ancient ones – the Ancestral Puebloan people – lived thousands of years ago. The Navajo Nation has an array of ancient ruins, including the world renowned Navajo National Monument and the tranquil Chaco Culture National Historical Park. From the towering formations of Monument Valley to the majestic red sandstone walls and lush green valley floor of Canyon de Chelly, this is a land of great contrasts. We invite you to Discover Navajo.

ZUNI PUEBLO

Zuni Pueblo is the largest of the nineteen New Mexican Pueblos, covering more than 700 square miles with a population of over 10,000.

It is considered the most traditional of all the New Mexico Pueblos, with a unique language, culture and history that resulted in part from the Zuni's geographic isolation. With perhaps 80% of the Zuni workforce involved in creating art, it is indeed an "artist colony." The main industry is the production of art, including inlay silverwork, stone fetish carving, pottery and other mediums many of which are world famous.

Stop by the Visitor Center for information to see the historic Nuestra Señorade Guadalupe mission and world-famous murals of Zuni ceremonial figures. Don't miss the original 1776 San Miguel altar bulto/statue at the Visitor Center.

Learn about the A:shiwi/Zuni culture at A:shiwi A:wam Museum and Heritage Center featuring an exhibit on the ancestral village of Hawikku.

Photography: inquire about guidelines and purchase Photo Permits at the Visitor Center. A Photo Permit is required for all photography on the Reservation. Remember to ask permission before photographing people. It is never appropriate to photograph religious or cultural activities.

To experience art immersion in the Zuni Pueblo, visit the Zuni Pueblo Art walk.

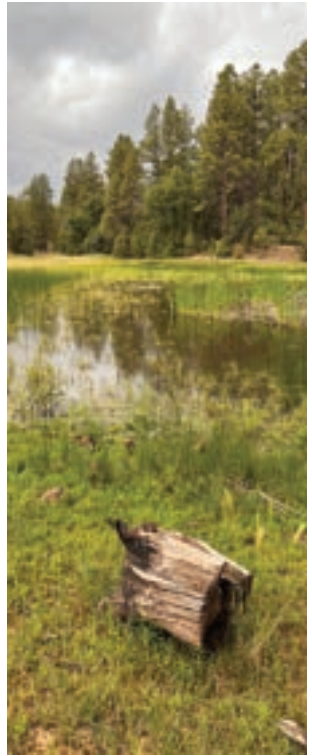

Located within the Old Santa Fe Railway station, the center features the Storyteller Museum, Rt 66 Theatre, Master's Gallery, Harvey Girl room, plus statues of Chief Manuelito (Tim Washburn) and Navajo Code Talker (Oreland Joe). While visiting, enjoy lunch at Angela's Café voted, Gallup's Best Sandwich and get a treat at Juniper Bakery voted Gallup's Best Bakery.

OUTDOOR MURALS HISTORIC DOWNTOWN

Gallup has murals that cover all aspects of Gallup History, including the history of the railroad,

Route 66, mining, Code Talkers, Ceremonial and much more. Stop by the Chamber of Commerce to pick up a mural map.

VISIT RED ROCK PARK

Located 6 miles east of Downtown Gallup just off Historic Route 66. Red Rock Park has a museum that features exhibits on the Anasazi, Zuni, Hopi, and Navajo Tribes. Red Rock Park also has the Pyramid and Church Rock hiking trails.
